I'm sorry I couldn't do Monday but I hope Tuesday morning is ok.

Site 1: Brigstock Camp- Heritage Assets Brigstock Camp Built 1928 as an emigration camp for Canadians latterly refurbished as an army camp. The site has some surviving buildings representing this period which may need a heritage assessment.

Site 2: Land off Woodyard Close- The site contains extensive ridge and furrow remains. The archaeological potential is currently unknown as only geophysical survey has been undertaken on the site. The trial trenching component has not yet been undertaken. The site is currently part development proposals The site has a number of planning applications. It is within a potentially archaeologically sensitive area.

Site 3: East side of Grafton Road- A possible Roman Road the Gartree Road representing a possible section to west of Titchmarsh 'the gravel Walk runs across the north east corner of the site. Potential for activity in this area and further information would be needed.

Site 4:North of Stanion Road- No known archaeological activity but cropmarks to the north are indicative of Romano British activity. The landscape to the south contains extensive prehistoric activity. Potential for activity in this area and further information would be needed.

Site 5: Pocket Park- The site is mainly quarried.

Site 6: Hunt Kennels- extensive ridge and furrow earthworks. To the south east the HER records a possible Romano British –Saxon settlement. Potential for activity in this area and further information would be needed.

Site 7: Lyvenden Road - Contains a possible Romano British –Saxon settlement. Potential for activity in this area and further information would be needed.
